Congressional markup of the FY 2016 Agriculture Appropriations Bill

The House Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture marked up the FY 2016 Agriculture Appropriations Bill on June 17, 2015. The House Appropriations Full Committee is expected to markup the FY 2016 Agriculture Appropriations Bill during the week after the 4th of July recess. The Senate Appropriations Full Committee is expected to mark up their version of the FY 2016 Appropriations Bill sometime in July as well.

Please note the following table compares FY 2016 funding levels proposed by the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture to the FY 2015 enacted appropriation.
