Interesting Facts:

- The *Journal of Extension's* five year average acceptance rate is **36 percent**.
- Feature and research in brief articles go through a **double blind review**.
- From January 1 to May 27, 2008, 43.8% of visitors arrived at the site with no referral, which means they either have the site bookmarked, are clicking links from their email, or are typing the address to reach the site.
- Over 30% of visitors came from Google.
