## Date of event: September 18, 2021

### Goals of Event:

- 1. The primary goal for this project is to create a modern, advanced standard for presentations and give 4-H youth a multi-state platform to improve their presentation skills through feedback from peers and trained evaluators. The objectives to reach this goal are to:
  - Create, disseminate and evaluate a State-level survey to determine path forward for NE States 4-H Presentations Fest;
  - Create modernized, shared training materials and evaluation forms across 9 states for this event;
  - Provide training to 4-H Coaches, Evaluators and Peer Evaluators
  - Further develop and refine program materials after the event through evaluation, research and partnership with relevant Cornell and academic contacts and departments
- 2. A secondary goal (contingent based on if funding is identified or awarded<sup>\*</sup>) is to provide 4-H programs a high-profile tangible opportunity to highlight the skills we teach and recruit new 4-Hers to our programs. Objectives for this goal include to:
  - Record the NE States 4-H Presentations Fest;
  - Manage post-production of event content to be used as recruitment and marketing videos;
  - Distribution of recruitment and marketing materials;
  - Dissemination of program materials to national partners with the hope of funding and scaling up to a nationwide presentations event

- 3. Formal Speech

**Open to the following states:** Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia

### Age of eligible participants: 13-19

Participant selection: 2 youth in each category per state (Total of 78 youth)

**Event Communication –** Program information such as participant eligibility and guidelines will be communicated by the planning committee to program leaders. Program leaders will be responsible for coordinating with their state 4-H staff to determine how participants will be chosen to represent their state in accordance with local and state public speaking and communication contests.
